MG, There Is So Much Going On in the North!

Golf: Last year, Silver Lake Executive Golf Course was completely refurbished with new greens and tee boxes and greatly improved landscaping. It is a much-improved golf experience, according to those who have recently played it. Now, two more executive courses -Hill Top, near Orange Blossom Hills and Briarwood adjacent to Lopez Legacy – are due for the same treatment. These projects will be very well received.

■ Recreation Centers: First Responders Recreation Center, in the extreme northwest of The Villages, appears set to open on schedule this summer. It will feature a resort-style pool, a putt and play course, a dog park and more. Next up is Paradise Regional Recreation Center northeast of US441/27, proposed for demolition and replacement. Every single exist-



ing amenity will be retained, expanded, or improved. The proposal calls for another resort-style pool with a fire pit for lolling under the sun or moon and an expanded Mark Twain Library. The

existing pool and library are among the most-used amenities in the north of The Villages.

- Sports Courts: As this issue of the North Area News is written, refurbishment of bocce, shuffleboard, tennis, pickleball, and other sports is being rotated among the various Rec Centers at a rapid pace.
- Roads and Streets: Anyone who has traveled US 441/27 between Leesburg and The Villages knows about the traffic snarls along the way during reconstruction. It sure looks like it will be worth it with the improved flow and increased lanes when the work is done. Not to be outdone, Lagrande Boulevard, which parallels 441/27 across from Spanish Springs, is about to be converted from a bouncy carnival ride to a smooth street this spring.

THANK YOU to The Villages developer and the district and local governments for all the work in the oldest portion of The Villages. And thank you to the residents here who have been so patient as the plans have been developed and finalized.

Some good news for residents in CDD 9: If you have a bond on your home that was a part of the 2012 issue, the CDD 9 board has accepted a refinance offer for a large chunk of the bonds. The new interest rate will be 2.99% vs. the current 5.507%. Last year the phase 1 bonds dropped to 2.43%, the phase 3 bonds are not callable until 2026.

Got numbers? I mean house numbers, prominently displayed on your house? At the county level there has been a great deal of discussion about ambulances, CAN YOU SEE YOUR so as long as we are on the topic - if you needed an ambulance at 3:00 a.m., could they find your house number? The numbers that came with each house, the little stickers in the window, are close to useless, especially when seconds count. Try this - when

"More About Safety...Again!"

People tell us we should publish some articles about safety and maybe even teach some classes. Well, we have. About seven years ago the President of The VHA invited us to publish bicycling related safety articles in The VHA Voice. Since then, we have published eighty-four articles in our 450-word Bicycle Friendly Community Corner.

The Villages is a truly a bike friendly community, being recognized nationally by the League of American Bicyclists. This means that The Villages supports cycling with robust infrastructure (engineering), inclusive cycling opportunities (equality), education, self-assessment (evaluation), and positive encouragement.

Over the last eight years, we averaged teaching three six-hour sessions per year of adult education through The Enrichment Academy. The classes emphasize three main safety topics:

- First, we invest two hours going over Rules of the Road, including How to Navigate Roundabouts. This Death-by-Power Point program brings bicyclists in The Villages up to speed about bike laws in Florida. No one actually dies and the dialogue is always lively. Some Gulliver always exclaims: "I never knew that." VOILA, the light comes on!
- The second part of the class is basic maintenance. Bikes need more maintenance than cars to keep them operational, reliable, and safe. It is always a joy to observe a student successfully pump air into a bike tire. Another "VOILA!"
- The third phase of the class is riding in an actual bike rodeo. The instructors, all certified by the League of American Bicyclists, pace the class through a series of progressively challenging drills, culminating in a group ride that traverses a tunnel.

We also teach kids via The Villages Camp Villages. We have averaged three sessions per year for seven years. We teach the same things as we do the adults but in two-hours vs. six for adults. Hey, kids have more agile minds and quick-



minds and quick- **Dave Teaching Kids** - They Love Him! er reflexes than their fossilized grandparents.

We have also taught at schools in the tri-county area, including The Villages Charter School. We think it is important to "start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old, they will not turn from it." Bicycle and pedestrian safety education might also save a child from injury, or worse, when they are out-and-about on their own.

Our schedules are published in The Enrichment Academy flier and on its webpage (https://www.theenrichmentacademy.org). All classes are a lot of fun, educational, and cheap at \$10 per session. Check us out, you might learn something. Diana Mirkin is Boss/Chairperson. Dave Lawrence is Safety Director. Rose Jordan is Operations Director. Bob Jordan is Education Director. John Rohan is our Recreation Department Mentor.

FROM A RECENT STUDY, by John Castaldo, The Villages Health. "All golf cart crashes reported in The Villages, Florida, from July 1, 2011 to July 1, 2019 were analyzed in this study. Data were obtained from multiple sources to create a comprehensive collection of all recorded crashes in the area. Results and conclusions: During the observation period, a total of 875 GC-related crashes occurred, representing an average of 136 crashes, 65 hospitalizations, and 9 dead or disabled annually. Of all crashes, 48% resulted in hospitalization, severe trauma, or death. Of these, ejection occurred in 27%, hospitalization in 55%, and death or disability in 15% of crashes."
